Plastic bag charge: shoppers in England must pay 5p

From today, shoppers in England will be charged 5p for every plastic bag given out at supermarkets and large stores. It is hoped the levy will cut the 7.6bn bags given to shoppers at major supermarkets every year, and retailers are expected to spend the money raised from the charge on good causes.

England is the last part of the UK to start charging for plastic bags. The number of plastic bags given out by seven major supermarkets in England rose by 200 million in 2014 to exceed 7.6 billion - the equivalent of 140 per person and amounting to 61,000 tonnes in total.



What do people think?

The government hopes the English scheme will cut use of plastic carrier bags by up to 80% in supermarkets, and by 50% on the High Street. It also expects to save £60m in litter clean-up costs as well as generating £730m for good causes over the next decade.

Exemptions

The price hike affects only retailers with 250 or more employees, and unlike schemes in other parts of the UK, paper bags are exempt from a charge. Smaller shops are exempt from the rule change but may choose to charge shoppers for bags as well. Campaigners have welcomed the move, but called for the law to include all retailers and all types of bags.

What is being done elsewhere?

In 2011, Wales started charging 5p per bag and use by customers has dropped 71%. Scotland and Northern Ireland introduced their charges in 2014 and 2013 respectively and have also seen significant drops in usage.

In 2002, Bangladesh became the first country in the world to ban thinner plastic bags altogether, after they were found to have choked local drainage systems during floods.





L1 learners can draw single bar charts. For example just one country such as England, or totals for the entire UK (top row). L2 learners can draw multiple bar charts in Excel or similar.

Answers.

- What date did this charge came into effect? Write your answer numerically.
 5/10/2015 (from date given in 'sources')
- 2. How long ago did Bangladesh ban thin plastic bags? Current year 2002. E.g. 2015 2002 = **13 years**.
- What was the percentage drop in consumption in Scotland from 2010 2014?
 -12.8% (from table)
- 4. What percentage of £1 is 5 pence?i. 5/100 = 5% ii. 5% = 5/100 = 1/20.
- 5. Use the mean to calculate how much will be raised for good causes in **one** year. Decade = 10 years. £730m ÷ 10 = £7.3m.
- 6. If an 'average' person continues to use bags how much will they pay per year? $140 \times 5p = 700p = £7$
- 7. Write £60m as a number. £60,000,000
- 8. Draw a bar chart to represent some of the information in Table 1. You must give your chart an appropriate title and label the axes correctly. See notes above. Two examples here:

 There was a big drop in 2012 (the year after charges were introduced). Numbers increased slightly in 2013 and again in 2014, but are still much lower than when bags were free.
