A series of activities originally used in a mixed level group of literacy and ESOL learners. Based on information from Yesterday's World, Battle, Sussex, TN33 0AQ.

Main Curriculum References

Literacy

Teaching Ideas

- Read through text (page 2) with students - discuss any main points - ask a few questions to ensure they have understood main points
- Discuss commonality of digraph /th/
- Ask learners to go through text and highlight any 'th' word where they see it.
- Ask them to identify words.
- Give out the task (pages 3 & 4) and ask learners to complete the exercise individually (support as necessary) without referring to page 2.
- Page 5 is for ESOL student(s). Discuss the different sounds - there is no reason why the other learners can't be part of the process. Explain usefulness (for ESOL) of phonetic symbols for pronunciation.
- Ask students to put words into correct column. When completed, ask them to read you the list, so you can correct any mispronunciation of 'th'.
- Those who finish can complete the crossword (individually or as a small group).
