Teaching ideas:

Use for individual, paired or group work.

For group work read through text together and discuss.

For example:

- What is it? A web page. (Could also be a page from a magazine or travel guide).
- How do you know? The 'look', the 'table-like' layout, web address at bottom.
- What is its purpose? To persuade readers to stay at the hotel. (Also to describe).
- What persuasive features does it have? The star rating. The photograph. Use of adjectives and other persuasive language tempting selection, highest standards, well equipped, wonderfully relaxed atmosphere, etc.

Other ideas

- Cut up into paragraphs. Ask students to rearrange into a logical order.
- Discuss the reasons for each new paragraph, i.e. new topic / place.
- In pairs, ask each student to create three more questions about the text for their partner to answer.
- Students to find out more information about their local Hilton.
- Give each student two highlight pens (two different colours). Highlight all the facts in one colour, all the opinions in another. Now look at the article – which colour predominates?
- Look at the use of capital letters, commas and apostrophes.
- Students to describe a hotel or holiday home they have stayed in.
