5 min represents $\frac{1}{12}$ of one hour	20 min are $\frac{1}{2}$ of one hour
10 min are one sixth of one hour	30 min are $\frac{1}{3}$ of one hour
15 min can be expressed as $\frac{1}{4}$ of one hour	40 min are $\frac{1}{4}$ of one hour
45 min are $\frac{3}{4}$ of one hour	1 minute is $\frac{1}{100}$ of one hour
12 minutes can be expressed as $\frac{1}{5}$ of one hour	$\frac{2}{5}$ of an hour is 20 minutes

Teaching tips:

Laminate and cut up. Learners (singly or in pairs) to place cards under correct heading. As an extension ask students to make up their own cards to give to others. The last two rows are more challenging and could be omitted for L1 if need be.
