4. What happens to plants when they wilt?

They dry out E1.8, E1.9, E1.10, 1 mark

- 1. What record was broken in February 2020? E3.9. 1 mark
 It was the wettest February on record. There were more active flood alerts than ever before.
- 2. Which river flooded the pub in the picture? What town is it near? It is the River Severn, near Ironbridge. E2.12. 2 marks
- 3. What had replaced the floods by the end of May? Floods were replaced by cracked ground, wilting crops and parched, brown lawns. E3.9. 1 mark
- 4. Can you think of another way of saying "exceptionally low"? Unusually low / abnormally low / lower than usual / very low / very much lower than normal / etc. E2.10, E3.11. 1 mark
- 5. What happened in Haddenham? The ground cracked. E2.12. 1 mark
