

Instructions and teaching ideas



Three sets of dominoes to use as a warm-up, and for letter and word recognition activities. They also make a good introduction to form-filling activities.

Print onto thin card and/or laminate. Cut each set into 17 (21) dominoes.

Set 1 is for pre-Entry ESOL and literacy learners with very low levels of letter and word recognition. Learners match lower case to capital letter versions.

Set 2 is a set of "doubles", which can be used alongside the Set 1.

Set 3 is for Entry 1-2 ESOL or literacy learners. Learners match a category to an example.

Each set has 17 dominoes: 4 each for a group of 4 learners, plus one to start. Each set also contains 4 blanks for students to insert their own categories e.g. "Age", "ID number", "Home phone", "Work status".

When sets 1 and 3 are completed, each forms a circle. Individual students can also set 1 or set 3 as a matching activity (when each is completed it forms a 'circle').
