

Dictionary Challenge Game

Angela Kennedy-Lockwood, the contributor, says:

My contribution is 'Dictionary Challenge', good practice for students in spelling, group discussion and using dictionaries.

My group varies from E3 up to Level 2. We used this game last week and everyone enjoyed it.

The game is played by two teams of four, each person has a sheet and takes turns giving the dictionary definition to their own team member, followed by their own definition.

They must consult with team members as they are only allowed one answer before it gets passed to the opposition to answer.

The team that identifies the correct word can then spell the word and create a sentence containing the word or pass it to the opposition as a challenge.

Words and sentences will vary depending on the students' levels.

Dictionary Challenge

- 1) You each have four words, give the dictionary definition and your own definition of the words to your team members for them to guess for one point. If your team don't know the answer it goes to the opposition for a point.
- 2) If you say the word when you give the definition then the point goes to the other team.
- 3) Whoever guesses correctly can then spell the word for an additional point or challenge the other team to spell it.
- 4) Create a sentence using the word for an additional point.
- 5) Spell it incorrectly and your team loses a point – consult with team members before accepting or giving challenges
