| communication skills | being able to speak or write in the right way for the audience |

| teamwork; team player | contributing practically to the success of the group |
| leadership qualities | motivating and encouraging others while running a team or project |
| work on own initiative | setting and achieving goals without having to ask others for help or permission |
| caring | thinking about how someone else may need help or how they may feel, and not doing or saying things that will not cause them offence or upset them |
| qualified | passed exams relevant to the job |
| friendly | smiling, welcoming and taking an interest in others without being too loud |
| problem solver | thinking things through in a logical or creative way to work out the most important problems |
| punctual | arrives on time, all the time |
| experienced | has done this kind of work before |
| organised | works in an orderly, logical fashion and knows how to find the required papers or information |
| proactive | seeing problems and the opportunities to solve them and making appropriate decisions |
| flexible | able to change and adapt to new situations |
| commitment | energy and staying power when carrying out tasks completely |
| interpersonal skills | relating well to others and building up good working relationships |
| self-motivated | natural enthusiasm to work well simply for the sake of doing of a good job |
| numerate | understanding and using mathematical information such as spreadsheets, statistics and graphs |
| reliable | people know you will not let them down |
| literate | able to read, and to write using correct grammar and punctuation, to choose the right words with the right spelling |

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Teaching notes:

Best laminated and cut into cards. Learners to work in pairs or threes to match the cards. Pages 2-3 are a duplication of page 1 but in a larger font. Can be used alone or in conjunction with the **My skills matching matrix** and the model **Childcare job skills description** resources (both available on www.skillsworkshop.org).

I put this together when I found so many of my learners trying to hone their employability skills did not know what a lot of the words on job descriptions meant.

The two linked resources, that also help students get to grips with the keywords used in job descriptions and person specifications, are described below.

Childcare sample job skills & CV is an exemplar job description for childcare position and an applicant's CV. Items can be taken from that and the teacher can model how to put them into the matrix.

The idea of the **My skills-matching matrix** is to create a "master sheet" of their own skills and attributes and give each item a reference number. Then they can go through the keywords on the job advert they are interested in and reference their own skills and attributes. Then, when they come to complete their cover letter or personal statement, half the work has already been done in a logical fashion.

This may sound complex but it is actually quite easy to do and, once a student has completed their own 'master sheet' they can use it again and again for any job they are applying for. I found it worked very well for my students.
