They are especially useful in formal academic and professional writing where clarity and logical progression are crucial.

1. **Therefore**

"**Therefore**" is used to show a logical consequence or conclusion based on the information presented. It indicates that what follows is a result or inference drawn from the preceding statement.

Example:

The experiment yielded consistent results; therefore, we can conclude that the hypothesis is valid.

2. **As a result**

"**As a result**" is used to signal the outcome of a particular action or situation. It highlights the cause-and-effect relationship between two statements.

Example:

The team put in extra hours to meet the deadline, and as a result, they successfully delivered the project on time.
