Spelling Magic!

Forming (writing) the past tense:

For most verbs, just add 'ed'.

plaster plastered paint painted

If a verb only has one syllable and ends [consonant-vowel-consonant], you normally double the final consonant and add 'ed'.

chat chatted stop stopped

If a verb ends [consonant-y], change the 'y' to an 'l' and add 'ed'.

carry carried supply supplied
