Writing about an object

Writing: text focus. Levels E3-L2

I'm using these cards to get learners thinking about purpose of text and writing for a particular purpose. You could use it as an introductory exercise or for consolidation.

Tutor activity:

Print out and cut up the card sheet; laminate if you like.

Put an object (houseplant, headphones, cheese grater, woolly hat etc.) in the middle of each small group and hand one card out to each learner. Differentiate according to learners' needs, working levels of English and interests (edit for simpler language if needed).

Learner activity:

Use the brief on the card to plan, draft and write a piece about the object in front of you.
