

Past Tense ESOL resources for Entry 2

Author's notes

Here is a selection of speaking, listening, reading and writing resources that I use with Entry 1-2 students.

I use the pairs / pelmanism game (pages 6-7) with lower level ESOL learners after teaching the past simple tense of regular verbs and selected common irregular ones. They play it in twos rather than as a whole class.

The text about Sarah (page 8) can be used as a general comprehension exercise and to check understanding of the past tense. It can also be used as a model text for class discussion before students write their own short recounts.

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Main ESOL Curriculum References

The simple past tense is referred to in many aspects of E1 and E2 speaking and listening. For reading and writing, the curriculum (pages 30-31) lists the following details under E2 Key Grammatical Structures.

E2 Simple and compound sentences

Verb forms and time markers in statements, interrogatives, negatives and short forms

Simple past tense of regular and common irregular verbs with time markers such as *ago*. E.g. We went to the cinema yesterday. I saw her two weeks ago.

Past Simple Tense

Regular Verbs

The Past simple tense is used to talk about things that happened in the past.

With regular verbs, it is formed by adding –ed to the infinitive of the verb.

walk ⇒ walked

look ⇒ looked

help ⇒ helped

The past tense is the same for all persons.

I walked to the shop

She walked to the shop

They walked to the shop

However, there are some irregular verbs which are not formed by adding –ed.

You need to remember them.

Irregular Verbs Past Simple Tense

Irregular Verbs

There are many verbs which are irregular in the past tense. You need to remember them. The verb *to be* is the most irregular verb in the past tense. It is the only past tense verb that changes according to person.

<i>to be</i>		
	Present Tense	Past Tense
I	am	<i>was</i>
You	are	<i>were</i>
He / She / It	is	<i>was</i>
We	are	<i>were</i>
They	are	<i>were</i>

Some other verbs which are irregular in the past tense are:

have	⇒	had
do	⇒	did
go	⇒	went
see	⇒	saw

These verbs are the same in all persons.

I went to the shop

She went to the shop

We went to the shop

There are many more irregular verbs in the past tense, but we will study them later.

What is a verb?

1. A verb is a doing word, it shows an action.

- I walked the dog

walked is the verb

- The team played football

played is the verb

- The lion ate its dinner

ate is the verb

2. A verb is also a being or feeling word.

- I am at the football match

am is the verb

- He was late for work

was is the verb

- Jack felt ill

felt is the verb
