

# A fork lift truck Information



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### 'Guess the Country'

#### Objectives

- Each student to present facts about a 'secret' country (e.g. Brazil) to the group.
- The group tries to guess which country the facts refer to.

#### Instructions

- Use the Internet to research at least ten facts about the country.
- Choose five of the facts and write them out as statements.
- Read the statements to the group (one at a time) and ask them to guess the country you have researched.
- The 'guessers' start off with 5 points. If they guess correctly after the first clue they get 5 points, if they guess after the second clue they get 4 points, etc.

#### Tutor notes

Ask students to choose a country that they would like to visit. Encourage them to think widely – I used an atlas to show them Brazil. The secret is to act as if you are all learning together – this is often true anyway e.g. 'I didn't know the Falklands were there'.

Show students how to adapt the facts and make them into statements. Five is enough. Explain that the statements will be put to the group and that some facts will be more useful than others in helping the group to guess the correct country.

Explain that the statements should be clear but 'elusive' – this will develop their discriminatory skills and encourage scrutiny of text. Explain that they should leave the 'key' statement until last (e.g. The footballer Pele is from this country).

#### Facts about Brazil

- 1. In 2003 the population of Brazil was 175.9 million which makes it the sixth largest populated country in the world.
- 2. The language spoken is Portuguese.
- 3. The capital city is Brasilia although it used to be Rio de Janeiro.
- 4. The Amazon River is the source of 20% of the world's fresh water.
- 5. The Brazilian flag is green with a large yellow diamond in the centre bearing a blue celestial globe with 27 white five-pointed stars (one for each state and the Federal District) arranged in the same pattern as the night sky over Brazil.
- 6. Emerson Fittipaldi was Brazil's first Formula 1 championship winner in 1972.
- 7. In 2002 Brazil won their fifth FIFA World Cup Championship.
- 8. Ronaldo scored the two goals in the match against Germany.
- 9. Major export products include aircraft, coffee, vehicles, soybean, iron ore, orange juice.
- 10. Seasons in Brazil are the reverse of those of Europe.

Spring: 22nd September - 21st December Summer: 22nd December - 21st March Autumn: 22nd March - 21st June Winter: 22nd June - 21st September


