Individual tubes of Smarties are £0.45 each.

Easter Eggs - value for money?

Answers. Note: these were the prices in Sainsburys on 14th March 2012.
How can you work out which Easter egg is the best value for money?
Divide the price by the weight in grams, then multiply by 100, to find the cost per 100 grams.

Type of egg	Price	Weight	Cost per 100g
Dairy Milk Egg	£3.20	343 grams	£0.93
Flake Egg (large)	£3.20	273 grams	£1.96
Maltesers Egg	£1.00	158 grams	£0.63
Smarties Egg	£3.00	138 grams	£2.17

Which egg is the best value?

The Maltesers egg has the lowest cost per 100 grams.

Now find the price of the same type of chocolate in an ordinary bar or packet. Write down the prices and the weights in the table below.

Type of chocolate	Price	Weight	Cost per 100g
Dairy Milk chocolate bar	£1.99	230 grams	£0.87
Pack of 4 Flakes	£1.79	102 grams	£1.75
Maltesers box	£4.00	360 grams	£1.11
Pack of 4 tubes of Smarties	£1.59	152 grams	£1.05

Which bar/box is the best value?

The Dairy Milk chocolate bar has the lowest cost per 100 grams.

Is a bar of chocolate better value than an Easter egg? **Yes**

Why? **With an egg, you pay for the extra packaging.**

The Dairy Milk bars were on offer at "Buy two for £3".

What is the cost per 100 grams if you buy two bars? **£0.65**

Individual tubes of Smarties are £0.45 each.

Is this better value than buying a pack of 4 tubes?

No, cost of a pack of 4 (£1.59) divided by 4 = £0.40 per tube.

Festivals from different faiths and cultures



Easter is the most important Christian festival. It celebrates Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead. The date of Easter changes each year as it is linked to the lunar calendar. Churches are filled with flowers, and there are special hymns and songs. Not all Easter customs are Christian; some, such as the Easter Bunny, are Pagan in origin.

Originally Easter was called Pascha after the Hebrew word for Passover, a Jewish festival that happens at this time of year. It was replaced by Easter, a word which is believed to have evolved from Eostre, the name of the Anglo-Saxon goddess of fertility and springtime.

Jews commemorate the exodus from Egypt and slavery in the spring.

Muslim festivals do not occur on a fixed date either - they are also linked to the lunar calendar. Spring is the time for Muslim pilgrimages to Mecca.

Spring is the season where the Sikh and Hindu religions celebrate the death of the winter demon.

Vaisakhi, also spelled Baisakhi, is the Sikh New Year festival. It will be celebrated on 13th April in 2012. It is a long established harvest festival in the Punjab.

Holi is the Hindu Festival of Colours, which marks the coming of the Spring. It was originally a festival of fertility and harvest. It will be celebrated on 8th March in 2012.

Most Buddhists, with the exception of the Japanese, use the Lunar calendar. Wesak is the most important of the Buddhist festivals and is celebrated on the full moon in May. It celebrates the Buddha's birthday.

Pagans celebrate the Spring Equinox. It is a solar festival, celebrated when the length of the day and the night are equal (this happens twice a year, at Spring and Autumn Equinox). The Spring Equinox celebrates the renewed life of the Earth that comes with the spring.
