Dear Sally Smith,

I feel very strongly that Covid vaccination should not be made compulsory.

I understand that the statistics published in favour of vaccination, 50 % less patients requiring emergency treatment and ventilators, is a very good result for the patients and lessens the burden on the NHS. It appears to be an amazing result in favour of vaccination. However, I believe that these results do not properly reflect the true situation.

I know many people of all age groups who have suffered bad effects from having the vaccination. Some have been as ill as if they had had Covid. I thought that it was just a few people at first, but when I took my friend to A & E and told them he had just been vaccinated on the day before, they said that they had treated many similar cases. This has not been reported widely in the press.

I believe that because this situation is not proven and clear cut, then people should not be forced to have the vaccine. It may be better for the hospitals and NHS staff and therefore I think that vaccination should definitely be encouraged. However, not to the extent that workers in key areas such as the NHS and Care homes can lose their jobs if they choose not to be vaccinated, because of health worries or beliefs.

Finally, I say NO to compulsory vaccination.

Please can you make my opinion known in your constituency meeting next week and on into the House of Commons debate. There will be many other letters coming to you, stating this viewpoint.
