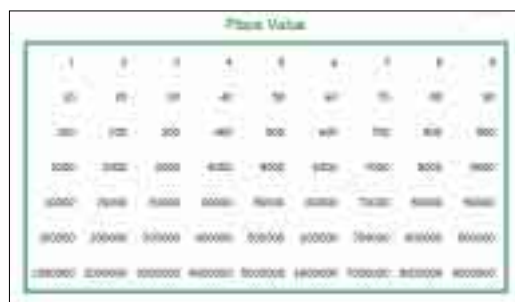
- The colour chart is for display using data projector or overhead projector.
